

#### **Darkness or Restricted Visibility**




Use a torch to illuminate sails in busy areas or when another vessel seen approaching

# Ships & Ferries

All competitors **must** maintain a minimum distance of:

- 500m from the bow of any seagoing ship
- 200m from the bow of any ferry #
- No less than 30m from the sides/stern of any ship or ferry underway. And.
- Must not cross between the bow of a ship and an escort vessel.

Fines up to \$1500 apply.

# Marine Safety (General) Regulation 2016 Changes

#### Safe Distance Off

- 1. All vessels, irrespective of speed, must stay 60 metres from:
  - a) any persons in the water;
  - b) a dive flag on the surface of the water;
  - or, if that is not practicable, a safe distance and speed.
- When under power, and travelling ≥ 6kts, you must maintain a distance of ≥ 30m from any other vessel (underway, anchored or moored), land, structures and other things,
  - or, if that is not practicable, a safe distance and speed.

# Marine Safety (General) Regulation 2016 Changes

#### **Bow Riding**

- 1. When under power, must not allow any person on board to extend any part of their body outside the perimeter of the vessel whilst it is making way.
- 2. When under power, must not allow a person to be on the bow of the vessel, in a position that puts the person at increased risk of falling overboard, while the vessel is making way.

# Marine Safety (General) Regulation 2016 Changes

#### Lifejacket requirements in your tender (less than 4.8m)

- 1. A lifejacket must be worn when:
  - a) the vessel is being operated between sunset and sunrise (i.e. darkness),
  - b) the vessel is being operated on open waters,
  - c) the vessel is being operated in alpine waters,
  - d) the operator is <u>alone</u> (i.e. not accompanied on the vessel by another person ≥12 years of age).
- 2. Children under 12 years must wear a lifejacket at all times;
- 3. If lifejacket not required to be worn, must have appropriate number and type of lifejackets on board for all passengers.

# YOU'RE THE SKIPPER YOU'RE RESPONSIBLE!

All competing vessels and support craft must comply with the Marine Safety (General) Regulation 2016 with respect to the carrying of all necessary safety equipment items and the wearing of lifejackets.

#### Safety Audits

- Audits for MHYC Members will take place at a time prearranged through the Sailing Office. Bookings are essential. Audits are subject to the availability of an Australian Sailing (AS) and MHYC accredited Equipment Auditor.
- Audits conducted outside of the Get Checked Weekend shall be subject to the following service fees; \$50 for Categories 1-2, \$30 for Categories 3-4 and \$20 for Categories 5-7.
- Equipment Audits shall only be completed on the official forms provided by AS and MHYC.
- All gear shall be laid out for inspection. Where equipment is not adequately laid out, the Equipment Auditor may refuse to continue the audit. The boat's 'Owner' or 'Person in Charge' and one crew member shall be in attendance during the audit

L Ashore: A notice to competitors has been posted.

Afloat: Come within hail or follow this vessel.



M The object displaying this signal replaces a missing *mark*.





Y Wear a personal flotation device (see rule 40).


#### VHF Radios
