## 7. DESCRIPTION OF INCIDENT (use another sheet if necessary) Diagram: one square = hull length; show positions of boats, wind and current directions, marks.

At approximately 1115hrs, prior to racing commencing for the Inshore Short Series and Adams 10 Spring Series races at 1300hrs on Saturday 22 September 2018, *Hugh S George* (race committee vessel for the SOPS race) laid an inflatable race mark in Chowder Bay at the request of Race Officer Toby Gursanscky. While an orange cylinder had been supplied for this purpose, a yellow cylinder was laid instead and the RO was not informed.

At approximately 1200hrs the race committee vessel for the Inshore / Adams 10 race, Sandpiper, laid an Orange inflatable race mark at Manly Point.

Course Naval 2 (Course 30 for Adams 10) was displayed prior to the Warning Signal for the race start in Hunters Bay Balmoral. The Adams 10 division started at 1305hrs.

A mix of fixed AS marks and laid marks are used for Course 30. Chowder Bay is listed at points 3 & 5 in the mark rounding order and Manly Point list at points 6 & 8. While orange buoys are generally used for rounding marks and yellow for the start & finish, the 22 September race had a Yellow buoy at Chowder Bay, an Orange buoy at Manly Point and a Yellow Start & Finish.

At approximately 1400hrs, *Sandpiper* set a Yellow inflatable buoy as the finish pin approximately 100m south-east of the Orange inflatable rounding mark at Manly Point. Sandpiper anchored 80-100 south-east of the Yellow finish pin in preparation for the finish.

At approximately 1445, the Adams 10s MH192, MH101 & MH308 rounded the yellow inflatable finish mark instead of the orange buoy laid to the north-west. MH36 rounded both marks and the remainder of the Adams 10 fleet (MH118, MH63, MH171 & MH26) rounded the Orange buoy only.

At approximately 1515, the Adams 10s MH192 & MH101 rounded the yellow inflatable finish mark instead of the orange buoy laid to the north-west. The remainder of the Adams 10 fleet (MH308, MH36, MH118, MH63, MH171 & MH26) rounded the Orange buoy only.

As the orange and yellow buoys laid in Spring Cove in the vicinity of Manly Point were approximately at 90 degrees to the wind axis, it is expected that the course length using either mark would be identical.

Note: Completion of this protest form was delayed due to the RO not being ashore until 1715hrs and presentations being held shortly thereafter.
